The school was founded in 1999 as a charter school and enjoys financial stability, high staff retention, and strong enrollment. Grove recently successfully completed its five-year charter renewal with the school district and holds a six-year accreditation with the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Grove is one of approximately 20 Montessori middle and high schools in the United States. It includes a working farm to fulfill Maria Montessori's vision of adolescents engaging in project-based learning, applied studies, and practical work.

The culture at Grove is welcoming, and staff members enjoy a supportive work environment. Most of our talented faculty have completed the AMI Adolescent Orientation, in addition to holding their California teaching credentials.

Grove is located in Redlands, a city of 70,000 with a rich history and an active local community. The city offers a strong economy and good employment opportunities thanks to diverse local employers, such as several medical centers, the University of Redlands, and GIS software developer Esri. Just 60 miles east of Los Angeles and 45 miles west of Palm Springs, Redlands is close to all Southern California has to offer, while retaining its small-town charm.

Grove shares its high school campus with Montessori in Redlands, a private school with a worldwide reputation for excellence. Together the schools serve students from 18 months through 18 years. The synergy between the two schools allows for the child to develop and grow through all stages of Montessori education.

- Continue the growth of the high school program and increase retention of high school students.
- Oversee expansion of facilities and services to meet growing enrollment and provide greater academic and occupational opportunities for the students.

- Serve as an ambassador for Grove to the broader community of Redlands and the Inland Empire region, as well as within the global Montessori community.
- Strengthen the fund development program to support long-term growth and sustainability.
